618	<p><b>National Council of Jewish Women, Search Department Records</b>  <i>After World War II, the National Council of Jewish Women ran a Search Department for Jewish survivors and tried to locate American relatives. Collection contains records of these activities of the NCJW, 1946-1950.</i></p>
1139	<p><b>Abraham Cahan Papers</b>  <i>Part 1 of the collection is microfilmed.  Abraham Cahan was the editor of the Jewish Daily Forward from 1901 to his death in 1951. The papers contain correspondence with writers and manuscripts submitted to the Forward. 1902-1951.</i></p>
